- 2 rectangle - 4 foot wide, 6 feet tall

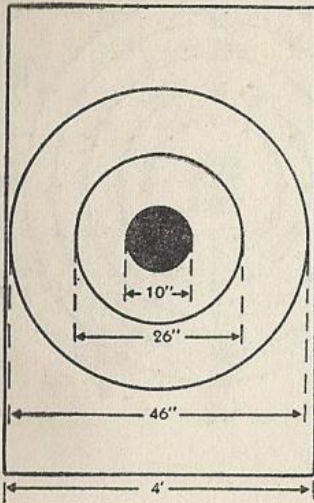
Baker

- 3 ring - 53 inch
- 2 square - 6 foot x 6 foot

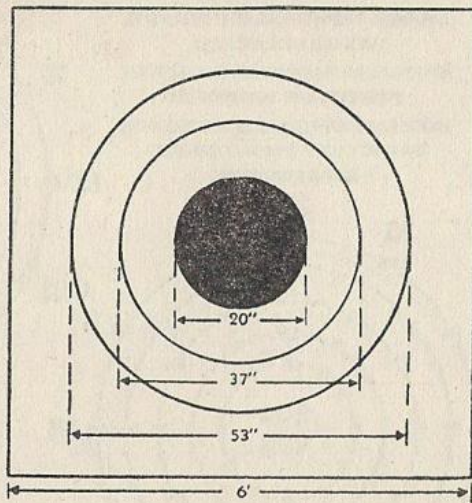
Dog

- 5 zone - 26 inch wide, 19 inch tall
- 4 zone - 34 inch wide, 37 inch tall
- 3 zone - 50 inch wide, 51 inch tall
- 2 zone - 6 foot x 6 foot

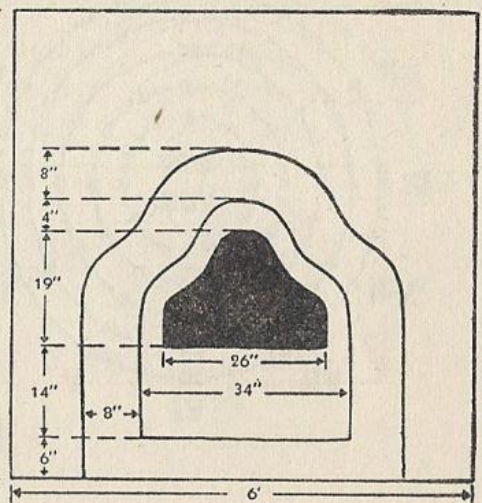
MODEL—DIMENSIONS TO SCALE OF A, B, AND D TARGETS
